Reminder for adults! Kids are watching you!

They are learning from your words and example. Winning is NOT the most important thing that happens at the Fair. The Fair is an excellent learning opportunity. Please focus on the youth's efforts, not the outcomes. No matter what the project or outcome is, try to encourage reflection.

Try asking these questions:

- What are you most proud of?
- What do you think you did really well?
- What areas do you think you could improve for next time?
- Who was the most helpful or supportive in this project?
- Look at other similar projects or exhibitors. What do you think they did really well? (encourage the youth to compliment at least one other exhibitor)

Cloverbud Projects & Fair Judging

Like many of you, we are gearing up for an exciting 2021 Outagamie County Fair! When you bring your Cloverbud projects to the fair, each Cloverbud will meet one-on-one with a judge. The judge will review each project and ask a few questions to the Cloverbud.

First time attendees and returning exhibitors might like to review the following questions as they may be used in Cloverbud fair judging.

- What did you make?
- How did you make it?
- Did you have any help?
- Why did you choose this project?
- What was the hardest part?
- What was the easiest part?
- Would you do anything differently if you would do this again?
- Why did you choose this color?
- What did you like best about this project?

The judges are very friendly and interested in your projects. Be sure to speak loud enough and clear enough for the judge to hear and understand you. Consider practicing with a friend or family member in advance of the fair.

We can't wait to see all of your projects!

Why do we have to do 4-H record books?

Records are a part of life. When 4-H'ers do a complete record book, they learn

- Organizational skills
- To plan and make decisions
- To identify and set realistic goals
- To objectively evaluate and critique their own work
- To accept and apply constructive criticism
- To analyze and manage project finances
- Great records help with filling out applications for scholarships



Record Books for 2021

The 2019-2020 4-H year was unique and unpredictable. **Moving forward for 2020-2021, record book guidelines and awards will continue as they have in the past.** You should be writing those goals for what you want to learn and do in each of your projects. Here are some tips for completing or improving a record book:

- Try to list at least 3 goals for each project.
- Be more specific when you tell what you learned and did in each project.
- Don't forget to talk about the financial portion of your project.
- Adding photos will enhance your record book.

2021/2022 Program Committees

The role of the Outagamie County 4-H Program Committees is to provide overall leadership to specific project areas and their related events and activities.

NOTE TO CURRENT COMMITTEE MEMBERS: If you are currently on a 4-H Program Committee and wish to continue, you must send in this form or your name will be taken off of the current list.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Gather ideas and suggestions from leaders and members involved in the project.
- Plan and schedule leader training or orientation for your project area so that leaders can better help their project members. (Note - this could include informational newsletter articles, as well as meetings and workshops.)
- Plan and schedule workshops, tours, special activities (example: state fair and Family Learning Day), and other enrichment experiences for project members and families.
- Provide leadership for carrying out events and activities planned (organize, schedule, communicate, promote, coordinate, involve, recognize, etc.)
- Acquire resources needed for events and activities (supplies, transportation, chaperones, facilities, etc.)
- Publicize your committee's activities by writing newsletter articles, displays, and other methods. Articles will be published exactly as submitted. (Note: newsletter forms are available in your committee folder and due to the 4-H office by the 1st of February, April, June, August, October and December).
- Submit detailed educational plan of action and budget requests for educational resources and project training to the 4-H Leaders Association executive board for approval no later than August 31.
- Recommend fair premium book changes, fair judges, etc. to the Outagamie County Fair Association.
- Periodically report your activities to the 4-H Leaders Association.
- Encourage both youth and adults to join your committee.

You may select up to 3 committees.

Note: Standing Committees must consist of at least three committee members (youth leaders are encouraged to participate), must submit a budget (even if zero money is being requested), and must submit an educational plan of action for the following year.

It was the first year of judging for two of the participants. Alicia Schroeder individually placed 7th out of 82 junior participants.

Livestock Judging at AASD

On June 22 Outagamie County 4-H Livestock Judging teams participated in Area Animal Science Days in Jefferson County. Congratulations to Brody Maroszek who took 3rd place out of over 60 junior youth.

Congratulations also to the Senior Team, Taylor Maroszek, Cianna Diedrich, Makala Paalman, Grace Angotti, Zoey Heimmermann and Emma Gagnow, who took 6th.

Horse Bowl, Hippology, and Speech

Five of the Horse Project members competed June 21 at Dodge County and came back with Grand Champion and top ten awards! Allison Harikkala received Grand Champion for her speech and is now eligible to compete against other youth from other states at the Quarter Horse Congress in Ohio or Nationals in Louisville, Kentucky.

Our senior horse bowl team also won Grand Champion but because we did not have four seniors, they are not eligible to compete at regionals and nationals. The seniors were Lydia Ewing, Keira Leitermann, and Allison Harikkala. The juniors were Isabella Maurer and Dylan Leitermann.



Allison, Keira, and Isabella received individual top tens in Horse Bowl and Hippology. Lydia received a Grand Champion for individual high point for Hippology and a top ten individual for Horse Bowl. Dylan received an individual top ten in Hippology. With both Horse Bowl and Hippology, youth answer questions on anything relating to horses from bones to breeds to body parts to nutrition.

The Horse Bowl is a quiz where team members have chances to win points based on correct answers and lose points for wrong answers. This quiz becomes intense as team members compete to buzz in with their answers. We began the year practicing and studying on Zoom and started meeting in person in May to practice using the buzzers.

All in all, these youth did an awesome job!
