Once enrollment is submitted online, a project cannot be added or changed after March 15.

All first year 4-H leaders (or returning leaders after 4 years being inactive) MUST complete the online volunteer application form: **https://www.4honline.com** and the required volunteer in preparation training. The training dates are listed in the calendar on page two of this newsletter or can be found by contacting the office. The state 4-H program requires that all leaders have a background check and go through the appropriate trainings.
