



A grant providing money for 4-H youth to implement community service/educational activities Sponsored by the Outagamie County 4-H Leaders Association

Who can apply? Any 4-H club or committee can apply for a grant covering 50% of expenses, up to \$100 maximum reimbursement, per service project.

(ie: club or group spends \$200, can apply for reimbursement of \$100)

 An <u>additional</u> grant of 50%, up to \$100 maximum, can be applied for if club or committee spends <u>additional funds</u> and members present their community service activity at an Adult Leaders meeting, and submit an itemized report of how money was spent.

(ie: The club or group must spend another \$200 to receive an additional \$100)

This is a <u>50% grant</u>, meaning that the Leader's Association will only reimburse 50% of your clubs or committees approved service expenses. The Executive Board will review/approve the grants during their regular scheduled meeting. Allow up to two months for approval/denial of grant request.

Where do the funds come from? Funds for this grant are from the Outagamie County 4-H Leaders Association. Fundraisers for the 4-H Leaders Association include the 4-H Dairy Bar during the Outagamie County Fair among others.

What kinds of projects can get support? Projects that:

- are determined and led by the youth, with support from adults;
- have a lasting, positive impact on the community;
- may involve organizations and individuals outside of 4-H as partners.

How do we apply?

- 1. Come up with a project that will benefit or improve your community.
- 2. <u>Attach an itemized budget/report with receipts for your activity</u>.
- 3. We encourage 4-H members to fill out this application themselves, or in partnership with an adult and submit it to:
