Scientific studies show that native plants are vastly superior to non-native plants in supporting a diversity of butterflies, birds, and pollinators. The importance of pollinators to human well-being is of increasing concern, as we see population decreases in these critical components of our ecosystems and food production systems. Approximately one-third of all the food we consume depends upon the work of pollinators to produce fruits, nuts, and seeds. Without pollinators, the food web would grind to a disastrous halt.
