You will have a much more rewarding fair experience if you are prepared.

### State Fair Exhibitors -

Age Requirement Animal Shows: Participation in Wisconsin State Fair Junior livestock and small animal shows (beef, dairy cattle, boer and dairy goats, poultry, rabbits, sheep and swine) is open to any Wisconsin resident 12-19 years of age as of January 1st of the current year and have completed YQCA certification. Youth Expo: Participation in the Wisconsin State Fair Youth Expo Department is open to any Wisconsin resident 12-19 years of age as of January 1st of the current year.



Junior Livestock entry deadline is May 25. #### **County Fair Animal Health Regulations**

Health rules for exhibiting livestock at county fair in July are posted at <u>www.outagamiecountyfair.com</u> select <u>entries/contests</u> then <u>health rules</u>. Note – swine require a certificate of veterinary inspection (CVI), also known as a health certificate, which needs to be signed by your veterinarian. The swine show is a non-terminal show. All hogs coming to the fairgrounds must be accompanied with a paper copy of a negative test PRRS and PEVD virus per farm. If you have further questions regarding the health rules, please consult with your veterinarian.

The fair must maintain records of persons who have exhibited at the fair and the identification of animals shown for <u>five years</u>. Acceptable forms of animal identification for breeding animals are: 1) An official metal ear tag number, 2) A breed registration number, 3) A breed registration tattoo. Breeding sheep need a scrapie tag. For market animals, an official ear tag number or the ear tag applied at weigh-in may be used. The number must be on the fair entry form. **Premise ID is to be included on the fair entry form**. Premise ID's can be applied for or renewed at <u>www.wiid.org</u>. The premise ID is where the animal is raised.

**Animal Fees REQUIRED** for ALL Open and Junior Fair animal exhibits housed during the fair.

•Animal Fee totals will be determined after your online entry has been received. Exhibitors will receive an email with the amount due and payment options within 10 days after entry deadline.

•Animal Fees must be paid to the Outagamie County Fair by June 20<sup>th</sup> for Junior Fair or July 15<sup>th</sup> for Open Class.

•Entry tags will be issued for animal exhibits whose animal fees are paid. These entry tags must be cleared by the superintendents on entry day. Don't forget to bring the entry tags with you.

•There will be NO refunds for animal exhibits entered, but not brought to the fair.

<u>County Fair Entry Day</u>: Entry of animal exhibits to the county fair activity is Wednesday, July 20, 10 am - 6 pm. All market animals need to be brought in by the time of scheduled weigh-in and ultrasound times (see General Fair Information). Should it be a warm day, please give careful consideration to the transporting of your animals. Livestock may be brought to the fairgrounds with superintendent's prior approval to county fair on Tuesday, July 19

#### After Fair Cleanup - Workers Needed

Adults and youth 14 or older are invited to participate in cleanup on Monday following the fair. Work will start at 8:00 a.m. Please send an email to <u>Outagamiecofair@yahoo.com</u> if you are able to work. Please indicate in the email your age.

Keep the Livestock Expo and washing racks clean – the county fair is an opportunity to promote agriculture to the public. Please clean up from clipping & shearing. No feeding on the wash racks

#### **Beef Exhibitors**

The bedding pack will be no higher than 8" to help offset the cost of manure disposal.



### **General Fair Information**

- All members need to sign the "Code of Conduct" form (one per family) and return to the Fair Association. Go to <u>www.outagamiecountyfair.com/entriescontest</u> s to get more information and the form.
- Weigh-In/Ultrasound: Remember that your animals may only be weighed one time! Weigh in will be in the livestock expo judging arena. Exhibitor must have carcass paper entry tag present at time of weighin/ultrasound.
  - Meat goats and sheep will be weighed 11:30 a.m.-12:00 p.m.
  - Swine will be weighed 12:00-3:30 p.m.
  - Beef will be weighed 3:30-4:30 p.m.
- Animal ID & Vet Check/Drug History form. Please bring 1 per species per exhibitor when you weigh in animals. No drug history slip, no weigh in. This form was in the February Livestock newsletter. Forms can also be found on our website at https://outagamie.extension.wisc.edu scroll on
- 4-H youth / project opportunities / livestock
  Tents that are up to clip and fit your animals are to be up the day of the show only and cleaned up from leftover preparation.
- Photo needed: Each exhibitor must present a photo (horizontal no smaller than 3" x 5" and no larger than 4" x 6") of the exhibitor and animal to be sold in the envelope provided by the livestock committee with your name and club on the back when you turn in your sales slip to the announcer's station in the Livestock Expo. After the animal is sold, the exhibitor picks up the photo and presents this to the buyer.
- <u>Ear Tag Replacement:</u> Any project member that needs to have an animal ear tag replaced must contact the respective project superintendent prior to county fair.

#### **Swine Exhibitors**

- This year's swine show is a **non-terminal** show.
- There will be no early release of swine this year.

### Livestock Judging Schedule

If any superintendent feels that your animal is out of control/dangerous, they have the right to pull that animal out of the ring. All swine, sheep & beef animals will be judged in the Livestock Expo.

The schedule for the judging of livestock at the county fair this year is as follows. Members are responsible to have their animal in the show ring when their class is called.

If an exhibitor is unable to exhibit their project, they may have another junior exhibitor from our county who is enrolled in the livestock project show their animal. <u>This does not apply to any showmanship</u> <u>classes</u>. The substitute must have <u>your</u> exhibitor number displayed on their back.



#### **All Livestock Animal Exhibitors**

- 4-H Livestock Committee will only pay for the trucking of the Market Sale animals. Upon release from fairgrounds, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to arrange and pay for trucking of animals that are not in the Market Sale.
- Exhibitor needs to turn in a Market Sales Slip for animals in the Market Sale. This needs to be turned in no more than <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> hour after the market animal show or you will not be able to sell.

<u>Volunteers Needed</u>: Parents, leaders and members are needed to <u>help set up</u>, <u>conduct</u> and <u>clean up</u> <u>from</u> the livestock shows and sale. <u>Norman Maass Memorial Scholarship Program</u>: The Norman Maass Memorial Scholarship was established in 1983 by the Maass family. A \$200 scholarship is awarded annually by Maass Livestock & Grain Farm, Inc. of Seymour. Applicants must have participated in the Outagamie County youth livestock program for a minimum of three years, be high school graduates and be enrolled in some post high school program with preference in the area of agriculture study. <u>No Drinking Alcoholic Beverages or Smoking inside Livestock Expo</u>: Show pride in your livestock project exhibits to our fair attendees.

### County Youth Livestock Sale Friday, July 22: The live animal sale begins at 6:30 pm (small animal

*at 5:30*) Sale of champions is at 7:00 p.m. Those of you that meet the county livestock sale requirements set by the livestock committee will have the opportunity to sell your market animal in the sale. Please do your part in helping to have a successful sale. Remember an exhibitor must have one year experience showing a species at the Outagamie County Junior Fair before being able to sell that species in their 2<sup>nd</sup> year. Also, YQCA certification by July 6 is required to sell an animal.

<u>Sale Brochures</u>: one is included in this mailing. Please use to promote the sale! If you need more brochures, stop in at the Extension office and pick up additional brochures from Vicki.

<u>Special Sales Slip Must be submitted</u>: Exhibitors selling animals in the sale must submit a sales slip with necessary information <u>within 30 minutes after market animal judging of the respective species</u>. NO **LATE SALES SLIPS.** Sales slips must be turned in at the judging table in the arena of the Livestock Expo. Slips will be handed out during the weigh-in at county fair on Wednesday, July 20.

Thank You Letter to Sale Buyers Required: All exhibitors who qualify for the sale must provide a stamped, correctly addressed envelope with thank you letter to their respective buyer(s). A drop box will be provided at the fair for exhibitors to deposit their unsealed thank you letter by Sunday, 12:30 p.m. Location of drop box will be announced during the shows. Exhibitor needs to supply the thank you card and stamped envelope (not sealed). Please write legibly. Thank you letters will be reviewed and if unacceptable, exhibitor will be asked to rewrite the thank you letter. Superintendents will mail out all exhibitor thank you letters. Exhibitors that do not provide the necessary thank you letter will not receive sale check until letter has been submitted to the superintendents. \*Mailing Addresses will be posted at the fair on Saturday and Sunday, please use postal address. <u>Master Showman competition</u> will be held Saturday, July 23 after the Pork Pals Spectacular in the Livestock Building.

Four youth livestock members, one member representing each category, Beef, Swine, Sheep, and Goats will have the chance to compete against one another. Each of the Supreme Champions will show one animal from each species.

Master Showman consists of the Supreme Showman from each livestock species: Beef, Swine, Sheep and Goats. The Supreme Showman is chosen from the top Showman of each age group in each species. A youth that has won Supreme Showman in more than one species will be asked to choose which species they would like to represent. The Reserve Supreme Showman will then be asked to represent that species in Master Showman. If the Grand Champion decides they do not want to participate then the Reserve Grand Champion will be allowed to participate in their place.
