Educator's Corner

When new families contact the Extension Office about joining 4–H, we send information about the Outagamie County 4–H program with a list of the clubs and where they meet. We encourage them to visit one or more clubs in their area and join a club that offers the best "fit" for the 4–H interests. I often wonder what kind of experience new families will have when they visit a club meeting? Will they have a positive impression?

With so many new families joining 4-H each year, we all need to look at how WELCOMING we are as an organization. At your next club meeting, evaluate whether or not your club has a welcoming environment. Consider the following:

- What was your experience like when your family joined 4-H?
- What is it like for a new member and his/her family when joining your club?
- Do some of your members make it a point to talk with the new family after the club meeting?
- Does anyone follow-up after the first meeting and contact the new family and answer any questions they may have?

Here are some suggestions to ensure that your club has a welcoming environment:

- Ask for experienced families to become "ambassadors" for your club. Their role would be to greet new families, make them feel welcome and answer questions throughout the year.
- Start a mentor program for new members and their families. A seasoned 4-H family could volunteer to mentor a new family during their first year in 4-H. Understanding projects, 4-H club activities, county activities and the county fair can be a daunting task in the first year.
- Encourage new families to attend the new family orientation.

Spend some time at your next meeting discussing how your club can become more welcoming to new members. Remember, everyone was a new member at one time.

4-H Enrollment Information

All enrollment for leaders/members/cloverbuds happens in 4-H Online: <u>https://wi.4honline.com</u>. \$5 enrollment fee for members/cloverbuds - Clubs collect money and send one check from the club to the Extension Office payable to Outagamie County Extension. Enrollment fees are due by December 31.

Reenrollment due November 15. New enrollment accepted until March 15 to be able to exhibit at the Outagamie County Fair. Once enrollment is submitted online, a project cannot be added or changed after March 15.

Volunteer Leaders

There are several projects that parents can be involved in. Please consider signing up for one to help youth learn and grow. Check with the main leader of your club for more information on leadership opportunities. You do not need to be an expert, just have a passion for the topic and learning.
