Scholarship Opportunities

CPF- Outagamie County 4-H Scholarship

Applications due before March 1

The CPF-Outagamie County 4-H Graduating Scholarship Committee will award scholarships up to \$4,000 in total per year, more if funding is available, to 4-H members who plan to further their education as a full-time student pursuing either a Bachelor's, Associate, or another certified, accredited program.

Eligibility:

1. Must be a current Outagamie County 4-H Member in good standing, having participated at least on the club and county levels.

2. Applicant must be a current 4-H member in their last year of high school or their first year of postsecondary schooling.

3. Applicant must have been a member for a minimum of 4 years with an accredited 4-H program and must be a current member of an Outagamie Community 4-H Club.

4. Must have a minimum high school or post-secondary school grade point average of 2.5. 5. Must send either by email, US postal service, (must arrive by due date) or drop off at the Extension office, a completed application form and necessary documents and letter, all together by 4:00 pm March 1, 2024.

Shirley Richardson Memorial & Outagamie County Home & Community Education Scholarships

The Outagamie County Home and Community Education Association (HCE) awards two \$750 scholarships annually. Both scholarships are available to a student who is completing their senior year of high school or a student continuing education on a full-time basis at either a college or technical school. The candidate for the scholarships must be a son/daughter, grandson/granddaughter, or niece/ nephew of an active member of Outagamie County HCE or must be a current Outagamie County 4-H member. Residents of Outagamie County and Wisconsin will be given first preference. A candidate will only be eligible to receive one of the scholarships. Scholarships are awarded one time per individual.

Plan

The Youth Leaders are in the process of making a 4-foot by 5-foot podium adorned with unique mosaic tiles designed by our very own 4-H youth. The inspirational artist, Mrs. Connie Greany, is leading us in legacy clay mural workshops. Mrs. Greany demonstrated clay building techniques, then each member was allowed to make his or her own clay tiles to add to the mural. These tiles will represent different aspects of 4-H as well as a "personal" tile for each participant. The pieces will be glazed, dried, and fired and then assembled into a beautiful mosaic podium.

This podium will display a journal in which anyone can share a 4-H testimony. The podium will be located in the junior fair exhibit building (#5) at the Outagamie County Fairgrounds.

- 1. Interpretive Reading of Prose
 - a. Participant selects written prose. Prose is ordinary language. It can include stories, play cuttings, narratives, or anything not written as a poem. The material is read with personal interpretation being presented. Un-memorized

- 2. Interpretive Reading of Poetry
 - a. Participant selects poetry. It may be a single poem, a cutting from a single poem, or several related poems. Poetry is rhythmical. The composition is then read with personal interpretation being presented. Un-memorized
- Interpretive Reading of Original Prose or Poetry

 a. Participant writes a poem or prose (story).
 The material is read with personal interpretation
 being presented. Un-memorized
- 4. Memorized

a. Participant selects or writes prose or poetry. The material is then memorized and presented without notes in an interpretive fashion. If desired, props may be used for this category.

5. Interpretive Team Reading

a. Participants select a prose, poetry, or drama selection that would be suitable for two to five individuals.

b. The grade category is determined by the oldest member. Please list all grades on the registration form.

c. Un-memorized. Props, costumes, and makeup are not to be used. This is not play acting; it is interpretive team reading.

6. Original Speech

a. Participant writes an original speech on any subject. A speech is not a story; it is one main idea that is developed and supported with facts.

7. Demonstration Speech

a. Participant writes an original demonstration on any subject. Demonstration speeches inform audiences about a topic or instruct them in performing a particular task, like preparing a recipe or using a product. Learning about demonstration speeches, their importance and how to format them effectively can help you feel confident when presenting them.
