Educator's Corner

My name is Alyssa Seitz, and I am the new 4-H Associate Educator for Outagamie County. I am a past member of Outagamie County 4-H, spending 11 years as a member of the Crystal Star 4-H club in Osborn. After high school, I attended the University of Wisconsin-River Falls, receiving my degree in Dairy Science-Management Emphasis, with a minor in Agricultural Business. I then attended the University of Wisconsin-Madison for my masters in Meat/Dairy Science. My thesis focused on dairy/beef cattle nutrition and its effect on meat quality and beef sensory aspects.

My role in 4-H extension focuses mainly on recruiting. Our biggest goal is to increase the number of 4-H clubs in the Appleton area, an area that typically has seen less involvement. I have been working with after-school programs in the county to get programming to new audiences, with the hope of exposing more kids to 4-H that might not have had the opportunity in the past. I will also be working heavily with ChickQuest, a program launched in Outagamie County last year that hatches live chicks in third grade classrooms, introducing them to the life cycles of animals, as well as showing off the opportunities available in 4-H.

I look forward to meeting and working with you all in the coming months!

DUE TO CLUB MAIN LEADER BY AUGUST 15

Why do we have to do 4-H record books?

Records are a part of life. When 4-H'ers do a complete record book, they learn:

- Organizational skills.
- To plan and make decisions.
- To identify and set realistic goals.
- To objectively evaluate and critique their own work.
- To accept and apply constructive criticism.
- To analyze and manage project finances.
- Great records help with filling out applications for scholarships.

Record book guidelines and awards will continue as they have in the past. You should be writing those goals for what you want to learn and do in each of your projects. Here are some tips for completing or improving a record book:

- Try to list at least 3 goals for each project.
- Be more specific when you tell what you learned and did in each project.
- Don't forget to talk about the financial portion of your project.
- Adding photos will enhance your record book.

During the next two years, 4-H members will have the opportunity to earn 8 different Jibbitz.


Where did they come from? Youth from around Wisconsin were challenged with creating and choosing 8 unique designs for the Wisconsin 4–H Movement Jibbitz. From the initial designs, the original 2 designs of Chris Clover and Wisconsin with the clover on it were created with the help of WLC members. Three more designs were created at Fall Forum 2023 and the remaining designs were inspired or designed by 4–H youth members in the Wisconsin 4–H program. The 8 designs represent the 6 values of the Wisconsin 4–H Movement, incorporate Chris Clover (the mascot of the Wisconsin 4–H Movement), and include a 4–H clover.

How to collect all 8? Jibbitz will be released at various events throughout the state of Wisconsin and in county programs. Youth might not be able to get all 8 Jibbitz at one event, but they can trade at other events.

How to wear them? Jibbitz are typically found on Croc type shoes, but can be worn as bracelets and in a variety of other ways.

Where do I find them? 2024 Base and Outpost Camp and 2025 Music & Talent Festival.

Look for more Jibbitz at statewide events and additional county events to follow.
