4-H STEAM Camps

Outagamie County 4-H will be hosting 3 STEAM camps this year:

LEGO Camp: Our first STEAM camp will be July 15 and 16 for grades K-5. Camp will go from 6:00 - 8:00 pm. Youth will learn how to build things like bridges, towers and more like in the real world. There is no cost to this camp.

Cardboard Camp: This camp will be on July 23 and 24 for grades 3-8. Camp will go from 6:00 - 8:00 pm. This camp will focus on building things with cardboard. Youth will learn skills not only in STEAM, but also that you don't need to buy things to have fun and that even the box is fun!! There is no cost to this camp.

Rocketry Camp: This camp will be on July 30 from 6:00 - 8:00 pm with a launch date and time to come later. You must attend both days of this camp, and must be in at least 5th grade. At this camp, youth will build model rockets and launch them. Cost \$10.

For cardboard and LEGO camps, older youth may attend, however the project is targeted for grades listed above. Attending both days is not required but highly recommended. Parents welcome.

Due to your Main Leader by August 15 or date requested by the Main Leader.

NEW for 2025 - Two Options

- EZ Form Fulfills the Record Book requirement, but does NOT qualify for awards.
- Record Book Can be nominated for county awards.

Who does a 4-H Record Book?

- Each 4-H member in grades 3-13 is highly encouraged to do a 4-H Record Book every year.
- Cloverbuds may complete the special 4-H Cloverbud Record Book.
- Also available in 2025 is a 4-H EZ Record Book Form. The EZ Form is NOT eligible for awards.

Why do a 4-H Record Book?

- The 4-H Record Book is a valuable part of the 4-H program.
- This book will be a record of your activities, challenges, and accomplishments, as well as documentation of what you have learned throughout your project work and club year.
- Your record book will also help others to know and understand you and to evaluate your progress and achievements.
- It gives you the opportunity to be recognized on the club and county levels.
- Over the years, your record books will reflect your growth in project work, as well as in leadership, citizenship, and community service. That information will be extremely useful to you when completing future awards, scholarship, college, and/or job applications.
- Record books will help you to develop skills in goal setting, planning, organizing, evaluating, and writing.

Horse Bowl for seniors is double elimination. Our seniors had to win the last two games against Waushara County and they did. Keira Leitermann received Grand Champion for Horse Bowl Individual and her brother Dylan received Reserve Champion Individual. Other members on the Senior Team to help them win were Kaiya and Sophie Wheaton.

The Junior Team recieved a Top Ten and was made up of three members: Allison Maass, Kensley Breaker, and Kyleigh Leitermann. Kyleigh and Kensley also received Top Ten Individual awards.

The Senior and Junior Hippology Team results will be given in September in Milwaukee after the Judging Competition as that has a combined score. Keira received a 3rd for Individual Hippology and Kaiya received a 6th place. On the Junior Team Allison received a 5th and Kensley received an 8th for individual scores.

4-H History

4-H History Segment V

1990s - 2000s

Project training and development continued to be a major focus of the county 4-H program in the 1990s. This focus was an emphasis with county 4-H program committees, with the county resource leader staff, and through the newsletter to 4-H families.

The first Outagamie County 4-H Project Learning Day was held on 02/23/1991 at the Fox Valley Technical College with 15 different project offerings instructed by county resource leaders. The event has continued for ten consecutive years. A district 4-H Project Leader Winter School for adult and teen leaders only had been held the previous five years. The new event was for leaders, members, and parents.

County 4-H enrollment went on computer for the first time. Members and leaders were assigned a 4-H number for their entire 4-H membership. Leaders no longer had to write out the fair entry tags. The computer even determined the county fair premium amounts and printed the fair checks. A great deal more information was made available to 4-H club main leaders and project leaders as the years progressed.

The Japanese LABO 4-H Exchange was introduced into Outagamie County through the interests of Debra Court and Connie Frassetto. 4-H members that have participated in the LABO Exchange in the 1990s include Jason Court, Jed Court, Jim Frassetto, Andy Schuh, and Jessie Schueler.

The 1990s had increased participation in both the county 4-H drama and music festivals. A county 4-H band was organized in 1998 and a county 4-H chorus in 1999. Both performed at the county fair event. Joanne Wussow and Kay Otto were appointed the dairy bar superintendents in 1991. Both Joanne and Kay have continued their annual appointment through 2000. Duane Wussow and Bill Otto have assisted them with many of the maintenance responsibilities.

Wisconsin hosted the North Central 4-H Leaders Forum from 10/13/1994 - 10/16/1994 in Milwaukee. Outagamie County had 15 leaders attend the forum. The event was such a positive experience that 19 leaders went to the 1995 forum in Minneapolis.

Wisconsin implemented the Youth Protection Program in 1995. All 4-H leaders were required to have a record check with the Wisconsin Department of Justice and attend a two-hour orientation program in order to be a certified volunteer. 4-H Youth Agents, Jeanne Baum and Bill Shaw, arranged and provided instruction at ten locations throughout Outagamie County for leaders to attend the special orientation. A total of 505 adult volunteers were certified that year.

1990s - 2000s (Continued)

A 4-H Leader Association Dairy Bar Planning Committee was appointed in April, 1995 to design and develop plans for a new 4-H Leaders Dairy Bar to be part of the new county fair grandstand in 1996. Pete Wachtendonk chaired the committee. The new food stand cost approximately \$34,000 and would be cherished for many years by 4-H families as one of their major fundraisers.

Sandy Wussow became the chair of the 1995 4-H Fall Harvest Dance. This event continued to be the first Friday evening in November as an excellent fundraiser for the 4-H Leaders Association and a fun activity for 4-H families. Bonnie Fischer became the chair in 1998.

Rose Rynish is appointed director of the 1996 county 4-H basketball tournament succeeding Gary VerVoort who had been the director for 25 years. The 1996 tournament was held in Hortonville after having been at Shiocton the previous seven years.

Debbie Wichman became the director of the Outagamie Big Pumpkin/Giant Sunflower Contest in 1998.

Outagamie County 4-H clubs designed and planted flower planters to improve the appearance of the county fairgrounds in 1999. A new commercial exhibitors building was constructed and the overall general appearance of the fairgrounds was improved. The outstanding cooperation of the County Executives, Outagamie County Board of Supervisors, Outagamie County Fair Association, and Outagamie County 4-H Leaders Association has permitted our county fair to be one of the best in Wisconsin.

We begin the new millennium with 36 active community 4-H clubs. There are also special emphasis programs for youth to participate in that include Adventures in Dairyland, Wacky Wild Weekdays, Tractor Safety Certification, Youth Library Program, and 4-H Day at the Children's Museum. There was also a Hmong Outreach Program for eight years. We now also have an urban initiative emphasis.

Outagamie County 4-H celebrated 75 years as a youth development program in 2000. An anniversary committee chaired by Elaine Koleske is giving leadership to suggesting and promoting ways by which 4-H members and leaders can highlight this special event. The history is being updated by Dorothy Paltzer, Marion Wichman, Marcella Koleske, and Bill Shaw. A special anniversary dinner was held in September, 2000.
