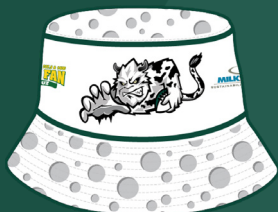

Poultry Project Market Updates 2026

Small animal project members, there have been changes to the market classes in the premium book this year. Please set up your market orders to be timed accordingly.

- 101. Pen of 2 Broilers 3.5-5.5 lbs. & 37 days of age minimum
- 102. Pen of 2 Broilers 5.5-6.5 lbs. & 37 days of age minimum
- 103. Pen of 2 Roasters 7.5-8.5 lbs.
- 104. Young duck, 1 bird over 5 lbs.
- 105. Young goose, 1 bird over 7 lbs.
- 106. Young turkey, 1 bird, 15 weeks
- 250. Meat pen of 3 rabbits: same breed, 69 days maximum, 3 ½ - 5 ½ lbs.
- 251. Single fryer: 69 days maximum, 5 ½ lbs. maximum
- 252. Roaster rabbit: either sex, 70-180 days old, 5 ½-9 lbs.

NEW THIS YEAR: All class champions MUST go to auction, but if your animal doesn't make class champion, and is still deemed market ready by the judge, you can opt to have one market entry included in the auction.

The auction this year will be combined with the regular livestock auction on Friday, June 26 at 6:30. Participants will be charged a 4.5% commission fee from their sales to pay for facilities, advertising, meal tickets for bidders, and ONE meal ticket for the exhibitor. Participants will also be required to sign up to help in some way with the auction. There will be a SignUpGenius sent closer to the fair to sign up for your volunteer spot.

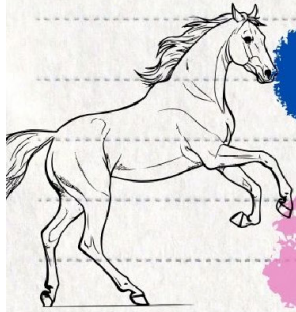
Processing Option: Mama's Poultry Processing, a small homestead butchering business out of Cecil, is willing to pick up from the fair upon check out, and professionally butcher your turkeys and chickens (no waterfowl or rabbits). Prices range from \$4.75 for birds under 6 lbs. to \$12.25 for turkeys. If butchering isn't your thing, but you want to participate in the market project, this might be an option for you. For waterfowl processing, reach out to Nate Rynish for assistance and for rabbits, reach out to Andrew Struthers.

*Please note that the butchered weight will be approximately 70% of the live weight.

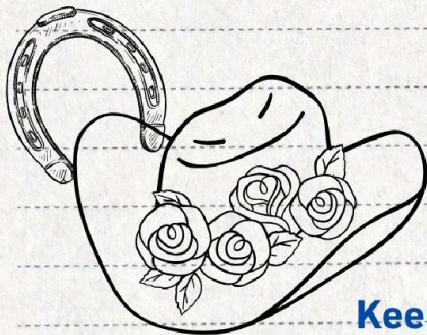
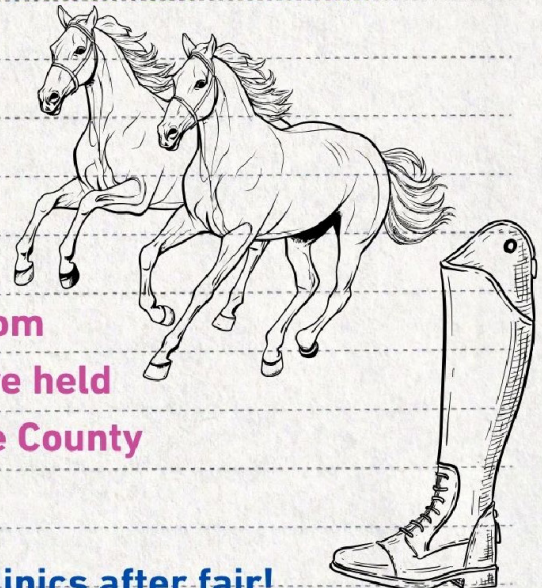

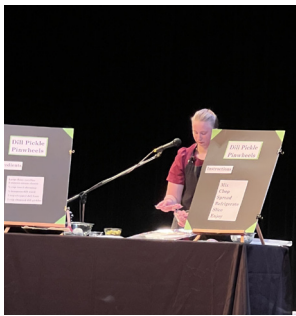
